'Hallmark' is a nationally HALLMARK recognised **Ouality** Standards scheme for village halls. It recognises good management and good practice. There are

three levels of excellence and each Award reviewed every three years.

In September 2019, we reported that the Burtle Village Hall had been awarded both Hallmark One and Hallmark Two. This project took eighteen months of hard work to complete the evidence required to meet the assessment standards which included external validation. We passed with flying colours with no action points which was unusual. We were also delighted to be awarded 'Sedgemoor District Hall of the Year' for 2019 at the Award ceremony.

Apart from proving the Burtle Village Hall is being run efficiently, legally, and is meeting high quality standards, achieving Hallmark had other advantages. It enabled us to obtain a discount on Insurance, to be put onto the National and Somerset Register of halls, and more importantly enabled our grant applications during the 'lockdowns' to be looked on more favourably - we achieved success with these.

The Burtle Village Hall Committee continued working on Hallmark and put in an application for Hallmark Three in February 2020 but due to Coronavirus all visits and assessments were cancelled. Our application stood for 2021 and our external visit and assessment took place

in July. Hallmark One and Two were reviewed and Hallmark Three assessed.
