Summary of Burtle Parish Council Meeting – November 2022

Highways Cllrs were pleased to note that the dip in Edington Road outside of Hillview and edge potholes in Edington Road and Station Road have been repaired. Clerk to draw highways attention to the deterioration of the road surface by Sweet's corner in Mark Road and several deep edge potholes in Westhay Broad Drove

Tipping in Catcott Broad Drove has resulted in the vehicles involved leaving large quantities of mud on the highway making it dangerous for all road users. Highways dept have swept the surface in the interests of road safety.

Speed Indicator Device and Road Safety no progress to report

Planning Cllrs unanimously agreed to support the following applications:

55/22/00005 Erection of new front (NE) porch and two storey detached garage with carport to the front (NE) boundary, with alterations to fenestration. Also, alterations to entrance gate, repositioning of oil storage and garden shed at The Old Vicarage, Mark Road, Burtle.

Cllrs did note that they were sympathetic towards the comments of a neighbour regarding siting of the external staircase and that it would impact on their privacy in the position shown.

55/22/00008 Erection of single storey rear (SW) extension with parking alterations at 2 The Cross, Catcott Road, Burtle
