Hi folks.

I've been reflecting on this over the last couple of weeks, as two category 5 hurricanes wreaked destruction in the Caribbean. I have a particular interest in Barbuda, one of the islands most badly hit (whose residents have since been evacuated to Antiqua), because my mother wrote a history of the island, from 1738 up to the emancipation of the slaves in 1833. The aerial photo below, from when we visited in 1986, shows just how flat the island is, with the 30m high 'highlands' in the background. There will be many in the Caribbean who will be asking themselves now, "where is God in all this?"

Whole books are written to address this topic! Let me offer just a few thoughts... It's only in recent times that we've come to expect life to be easy, so that anything else implies the absence of God. In centuries past, people expected life to be hard. Some who go through hard times find that God is with them through the darkest storms: not sparing them from the difficulties, but enabling them to endure and recover. We shouldn't be surprised at this: God didn't give his own son, Jesus, an easy ride, but led him on a path that ended in the suffering and rejection of the cross.

So, for those who pray, pray that those suffering the destruction of the hurricanes experience the depth of God's love in these difficult times.
