

Burtle Parish Council - Summary October 2018

Planning Permission has been granted to crown lift Horse Chestnuts in Mark Road, Burtle which are covered by a TPO. Permission has also been granted for change of use to equestrian from agricultural and erection of stable block on land adjacent to Chapel Hill Farm, Burtle.

Two applications have been received for Burtle Inn site following the withdrawal of the previous permission after the unauthorised demolition of part of the building. One is for retrospective permission for the North (Restaurant) end of the building and the other is for a new build on the Southern end of the site where the demolition has taken place. Councillors reviewed the documents and plans submitted. Unfortunately, the documents submitted are inaccurate and incomplete and Councillors had to defer their decision until revised plans and amendments are received.

Post box Royal Mail have agreed to the erection of a temporary post box following delays in removing the one from outside of the Burtle Inn because it is under the scaffolding.

Godwin's site South West Wood Products noted their intention to submit a CLEUD application some eight months ago but despite assurances that it is imminent it has still not been received meanwhile the wood chipping continues. Cllrs agreed to send a formal complaint to Mendip DC regarding the delays in dealing with the matter that has continued for almost three years now.

Shapwick Road Closure Cllrs were pleased to see that common sense had finally prevailed and the diversion route has been moved from Catcott Broad Drove to Edington Road. Clerk to Edington and Catcott PCs and Burtle clerk have been in constant correspondence with Kier and Somerset County Council to let them know that Catcott Broad Drove is totally unsuitable but no action was taken until, just as predicted, two lorries became stuck some two hours after the diversion was put in place.
